




【*Kojiki A-1*】 Separate heavenly *kami* (*Kotoamatsu kami*)






【*Kojiki* A-3】 The creation of the land (*kuniumi*) and the birth of the *kami* (*kamiumi*)




【*Kojiki* B】 The production of Izanagi and Izanami, and Kagutsuchi

【*Kojiki* B-1】

Izanami suffered mortal burns when giving birth to Kagutsuchi. Upon Izanami's death, Izanagi became enraged and cut up the newborn deity with the Totsukatsurugi sword, whereupon the deities* shown below were produced from the blood on the sword.



【Kojiki B-2】



*1: These deities were produced from the vomit ejected by Izanami.

*2: These deities were produced from the feces expelled by Izanami.


*3: These deities were produced from the urine expelled by Izanami.

*4: These deities were produced from Izanami's decomposed body. The body parts that appear in brackets are those places on Izanami's body from which the various deities were produced.

*5: Izanami suffered mortal burns when giving birth to Kagutsuchi. These deities were produced from Kagutsuchi's body. Their names all included the element *yamatsumi*, thus indicating their relation to mountains.






*⁴: produced from the blood on the section around the tip of sword.

*⁵: produced from the blood on the tip of sword.






Lineages of the deities in *Kojiki*

【*Kojiki* C-1】 Kami produced from the purification of Izanagi

Izanami died as a result of giving birth to the *kami* of fire. Izanagi followed his dead wife to the land of Yomi and violated her taboo not to look upon her. Fleeing from the pollution of death, Izanagi then performed lustrations that resulted in the birth of the deities below.



【Kojiki C-2】 Kami produced from the purification of Izanagi




*1: These deities were produced when Amaterasu broke the Totsukatsurugi sword that Susano'o had wielded.

*2: These deities were produced when Susano'o crunched the gem, possessed by Amaterasu.

【*Nihonshoki C'*】 *Ukehi* (trial by pledge) between Amaterasu and Susano'o.



*1: Amaterasu produced these deities from the *Totsuka no tsurugi* sword, possessed by Susano'o.

*2: Susano'o produced these deities from *Yasakani no ihotsunomisumaru* (necklace bound up gems), possessed by Amaterasu.



Yachihokonokami, Ōkunitamanokami or Utsushikunitamanokami)

Ōmiwanokami* ——— Kamonokimi, Ōmiwanokimi or Himetataraisuzuhimenomikoto

* *Nihonshoki* identifies Ōmononushi as being the same as Ōnamuchi's *sakimitama* and *kushimitama* (thought to represent aspects of a spirit that blesses its owner with success and health).


